Launch of the integrated management project for the bays of Ha Long, Hai Phong and Bai Tu Long

Hanoi, 11 June 2021 - The launch meeting for the integrated management project for the coastal areas of the Hai Phong estuary and the bays of Bai Tu Long and Ha Long took place on 11 June in the presence of Mr Vu Truong Son, Deputy Director General of the Vietnam Administration of Seas and Islands, and Ms Virginie Bleitrach, Deputy Director of the AFD in Vietnam.

Ha Long bay, a jewel in Vietnam's tourism crown and listed as a world heritage site, is the location of intense economic activity which presents a significant threat to its conservation: the biodiversity of the bay has already been seriously impacted by tourism, coal production and fishing and aquaculture.

Faced with this situation, the French Facility for Global Environment (FFEM) is providing €1.2 million to fund a project supporting the integrated management of the bays of Ha Long, Hai Phong and Bai Tu Long, which will help the sustainable economic and social development of this coastal area. The project is sponsored by the French Development Agency (AFD) and implemented by the Vietnamese Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment.

During the project's launch meeting, the various actors came together to discuss the programme of work and stages in which the project would be implemented, and take stock of the integrated management of the coastal areas of Quảng Ning province and Hai Phong.

The first stage of the project will be to carry out an assessment, comprising a description of the environment and a biodiversity survey. On the basis of this, the institutional actors and scientific and economic operators will work together to develop integrated management for the coastal areas through a "Bay contract" approach, i.e. a list of actions to undertake, in order to tackle the major problems affecting the bays. This work will be carried out with the backing of the city of Brest, in France.

For Janique Etienne, Head of Oceans and Nature-based Solutions Projects at the FFEM, "This project is an excellent example of knowledge transfer. The city of Brest, the project's partner, will share its experience with integrated management of coastal areas. The project also fits perfectly within the FFEM 2019-2022 strategic cycle, which encourages coastal resilience by managing their use, limiting pollution and supporting the development of sustainable industries."

This project should enable the sustainable economic and social development of the area, but also reduce the impact of pollution on public health and the environment, all while contributing to the development of the regulatory framework for implementing the integrated management of the coastal areas.

"I'm delighted by the launch of this project, which is essential to preserving the coastal areas of Ha Long, Hai Phong and Bai Tu Long. It lies at the heart of the cooperation priorities between Vietnam and the AFD for combating climate change and protecting biodiversity," stated Virginie Bleitrach, Deputy Director of the French Development Agency in Vietnam.
